Washington AWHONN Nurses in Atlanta



Celebrating 50th years of AWHONN, in "Hot"lanta (Atlanta) Georgia with over 3,500 nurses was professionally fulfilling and fun! Here are just a **few** reflections worth sharing! The opening session started with challenging us to **"Ask why, Dream Big and Step up"** and set the tone for the next several days.

We were moved by Lt Gen. Dorothy Hogg who manages the U.S. Air Force Medical Service. She is

a power house. We loved every word she shared but Top messages were:

- Remember it is your "attitude" not your aptitude that will determine your altitude.
- Think without the box (as compared to outside of the box), when times get tough we tend to jump back into the box.
- Change is hardest at the beginning, messiest in the middle and best at the end.
- Do one thing every day that scares you!

2 sessions presented "Integrated NICU/Couplet Care" This Model is becoming a national trend. One hospital cares for level 3 NICU babies on postpartum! The presenters believe "you cannot care effectively for a NICU baby if you do not let the care happen from mom".

Lisa Miller shared **AMNIOTIC FLUID LACTATE** testing may be the future. Currently there's a feasibility study on lactate and uterine activity. Lactate leaks from the uterine muscle and can be detected in amniotic fluid. The premise is an overworked, tired uterus is ineffective... lactate might be part the problem. Letting the uterus rest (which we all know from clinical practice), hydration and perhaps medication to counteract lactate may be effective intervention(s) if lactate levels are high.

We met Carol Decker (from Enumclaw), who fought for her life and survived sepsis. Carol lost her eyesight, feet, left hand and right ring finger. She is an amazing woman, with an inspiring story and an testament to the ability to adapt and do what seems is impossible and uncomfortable and still lead a beautiful life.
